

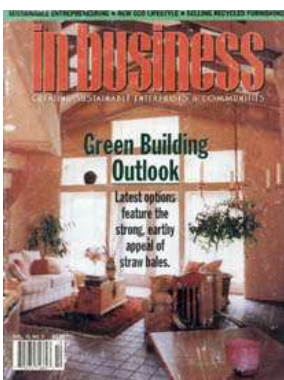
Our Pioneering Achievements
